I am a mom of a freshman at OSU Newark, a person in recovery and I work in the Opiate recovery field. I am seeing more and more families who are affected, teachers who are uneducated and a community divided and filled with stigma. This epidemic is unlike anything I have seen both from a personal and professional standpoint.

What do you see as causes of the epidemic in your community and in Ohio? :

Causes start at home, pills in cabinets, depression, anxiety & there is a need to fix our life's problems and a pill is the answer, sometimes. There aren't enough ways to express how as a community we need to support one another and our neighbors.

What steps might we take as a state to combat the opioid epidemic? :

There is just not enough funding nor are there beds open. We want to help people, but there isn't enough education, Support or continuing care.
